EXPLORING THE WORLD OF


SCIENCE

The activity involved sticking the soft board pins to the metal spoon at equal distances from one another using hot wax. The spoon was then heated at one end, and the learners observed how the pins reacted to the heat.

To showcase their understanding of the activity, the learners filled up an exit ticket individually through their iPads. This proved to be an effective mode as it allowed the facilitator to analyze each learner's understanding and provide personalized feedback.


PARENT ORIENTATION
